EFFECTIVE WAYS TO

COMMUNICATE WITH YOUR LEGISLATOR

GENERAL TIPS...

- Know where your legislators stand on issues that are important to your District
- Know their background and occupation (e.g. farming/forestry/development/education)
- What is their relationship to conservation
 Are they already practicing conservation?
 Is Districts' work and mission a new topic for them?
- Find out their House or Senate committee assignments – this is where they can have the most influence
- What is their passion why do they serve their constituents?
- Communicate regularly contact should not always be for "The ASK", become familiar 1st!
- Keep it short..., concise information & to the point.
- Use a personal story to relate your message.
- Don't discount an offer to meet with legislative staff members. They hold more influence than you realize.

WAYS TO GET INVOLVED...

- Stay informed on legislative issues at the Local, State, and National levels.
- Track Ky Legislation that are important to your District.
- Contact Legislators and/or Staff Members regularly to keep them informed about conservation and foster a strong relationship; as well as when expressing your position on an issue. (possibly quarterly or at least twice a year)
- Host local events for Legislators to learn about Conservation Districts and to meet with their local constituents.

(Roundtable Discussions, Farm Field Days, Conservation Tours, etc.)

- Invite Legislators and/or Staff Members to attend Board Meetings and Annual Meetings.
- Attend other legislative events such as local forums, town hall meetings, etc.
- Utilize media- it is one of the most powerful tools in grassroots advocacy (Local Newspapers, Radio, Television, Social Media, etc)




How to Make Contact....

Know who your Legislators are!
 Find your KY Legislators at <u>Legislature.Ky.gov</u>-under the Legislators Tab, go to Who's My Legislator
 Find your US Legislators at

Congress.gov/members/find-your-member

- Effective communication methods are emails, letters and phone calls!
 - Emails should be professional, respectful, concise and to the point. Include your address so they know you are their constituent.
 - Letters should brief & concise (no more than 1 page, limited to 1 issue), make it personal, & express your firm position.
 - When calling, you may reach a staff member or leave a message. This is a great form of communication as well, do not discount it. State your name, where you live, what the issue is and what you want them to do.
- Make an appointment to meet in person!
 - Legislators schedules are full, and fill quickly. Reach out early and plan for approx. 15 minutes.
 - Be Prepared, Be Prompt, & Be Patient
 - Be Open to meeting with Legislative Staffers, they are a great resource to legislators and constituents!
- Follow-Up and Thank your Legislators!
 - Thank your Legislators and/or Staffers for their time & no matter the outcome of the issue, Thank your Legislator. (an opposer of 1 issue, may be an ally on the next!)
